an insecure child who craves attention

to make it difficult for something to develop or succeed SYN hamper:

His career has been hindered by injury.

Rabbit hole

Cultivate

to prepare and use land for growing crops and plants:

The land was too rocky to cultivate.

Keep sb posted

keep somebody posted spoken to regularly tell someone the most recent news about something

keep somebody posted on

I'll keep you posted on his progress.

a period of time during which a service such as the electricity supply cannot be provided SYN power cut British English:
