#### drag someone into something

to make someone become involved in a situation when they do not want to

The US was afraid of being dragged into the war.

#### Social butterfly

a person who is socially dynamic, networking, charismatic, and personally gregarious. It may also refer to: Social Butterfly, a character in the comic book series Livewires.

#### Strike up

begin a friendship or conversation with someone in a casual way.

"he struck up a conversation with her in the lobby"

#### Surefire

certain to succeed.

"bad behaviour is a sure-fire way of getting attention"

#### Amp up

increase. to increase the power or force of (something) to excite, arouse, or work up (a person, emotions, etc)

#### **Epic Party**

a party of epic proportions, everyone gets wasted. party grows until the cops come in and end it. a party that everyone remembers. even the police.

#### Go south

fall in value, deteriorate, or fail.

"Lazio saw his poll numbers go south almost immediately"

#### A pill

a tedious or unpleasant person.

#### Put a damper on sth

have an effect on it which stops it being as enjoyable or as successful as it should be.

The cold weather put a damper on our plans.

#### **Blow**

an unexpected event that has a damaging effect on someone or something:

Losing his job was a severe blow to his confidence.

#### **Power outage**

an interruption in the supply of electricity:

Storms caused power outages in hundreds of homes last night.

#### **Bum out**

disappoint, upset, or annoy: It really bummed me out that she could have helped and didn't.

#### Skedaddling

depart quickly or hurriedly; run away.

"when he saw us, he skedaddled"
