Comments:

The candidate generally addresses the task, but only incompletely answers the last question. A position is presented, but ideas are sometimes insufficiently developed or extended so the argument is rather thin. Nevertheless, there is a clear overall progression in the response because ideas are logically organized. The candidate attempts to use a range of vocabulary and introduces some less common expressions, although with mixed success. A wide variety of simple structures is evident, but lack of complex sentence types indicates the limitations of the very task.

This response only just manages to reach an overall Band 5.5.

Comments:

You addressed all parts of the task; however, some parts have been less covered especially in the second part of the body where you were supposed to give more evidence on the idea, and it seems to be inadequately developed. Except the first part of the body which sounds to be a bit ambiguous, ideas in the rest of the essay are coherently arranged and there is a clear overall progression. Unfortunately, referencing has not been used clearly and appropriately. You made conscious attempt to use less common lexical items but there have been some inaccuracy. The range of structures is a bit limited while attempts to use complex structures, such as subordination, are rare.


