

The line charts provide information regarding the proportions of households possessing an electrical appliance along with the amount of time having been consumed on using them in a country between 1920 and 2019.

Overall, it is observed that despite the generally existing upwards pattern among all the three equipment, refrigerators grew noticeably in popularity. Households also developed an inclination towards minimizing the usage of electrical appliances over this period.

Considering the ownerships, although initially washing machines could be found in more houses than refrigerators and vacuum cleaners did (40%), by 2019, it was surpassed. This value for vacuum cleaners was 30%, while nearly no household used to own a refrigerator in 1920. However, the popularity of refrigerators surged to reach its peak in 1980 (100%) and by 2000, every household had a vacuum cleaner.

With regard to the amount of time taken up, initially, 50 hours per week were dedicated to housework. This value, however, constantly dropped to 15 hours by 1980, when it remained unchanged for about 20 years. Ultimately, the results in 2019 indicate a 40% fall, compared to 1920.
