The given line graphs depict the change of using electric machines and the amount of time spent doing housework in households in a region during 1920 and 2019. It is clear from both charts that the percentage of households with refrigerator and vacuum cleaner were significant, and the number of hours of housework decreased during the period.

On the one hand, using the washing machine, which was a significant percentage in the chart at first, was rising till 1960 with 70% and after some fluctuation in 2019 had the lowest percentage of households in all electrical appliances. The vacuum cleaner was the second usable electrical appliance in 1920 by 30 percent of households and, after huge growth in 2000 and gaining 100 percent of households, will keep holding this stage till 2019. The least percentage of households had an electrical appliance for the refrigerator in 1920. After a jump, during 60 years it can gained 100 percent of households in 1980 and continue this percentage to 2019.

On the other hand, the number of hours of housework per week with 50% in 1920 decreased to 10% in 2019.

Overall, most electrical appliances increased the percentage of households and the other side number of hours of housework per week decreased during the period.
