The charts below show the changes in ownership of electrical appliances and amount of time spent doing housework in households in one country between 1920 and 2019. Summarise the information by selecting and reporting the main features, and make comparisons where relevant.

The given line graphs provide information about the changes in owning domestic electrical devices, including Washing machine, Refrigerator, and Vacuum cleaner and how much time spent on household chores in a certain country from 1920 to 2019.

Overall, it can be seen from both graphs that during the given period, the proportion of electrical appliances ownership experienced an upward trend, while the amount of time allocated to housework such as washing clothes, preparing meals, and cleaning decreased steadily.

In 1920, Washing machine and Vacuum cleaner commanded the biggest share hitting at 40% and 30%, which rose gradually and in the year 1960, both appliances reach the equal percentage at 70%. In the year 1980, the percentage of households owning Washing machine dropped to around 65%, whereas the proportion of Vacuum cleaner was boosted sharply to approximately 90%. From 1980 to 2019, the percentage for both Washing machine and Vacuum cleaner went up slowly until the end of the period that reached nearly 71% and 100%, respectively. Finally, throughout the whole period, the proportion of refrigerator ownership increased significantly from roughly 2% to 100%.

In regards to the second graph, despite some fluctuations, the number of hours spent on doing housework considerably decreased from 50% to around 10%.
