Given graphs illustrate the percentage of electrical devices such as washing machines, refrigerators, and vacuum cleaners used in houses along with weekly hours which had been allocated to house-works including washing clothes, preparing meals, and cleaning in the interval between 1920 and 2019.

Overall, it can be seen that excluding 1960 to 1980 in which washing machine usage had plummeted, all three electrical appliances belonged householders had experienced an ascending trend while the hours allotted to house chores had been decreasing from 1920 to 2019.

Regarding the former line chart, having dramatically soared, fridge ownership proportion hit the peak of 100% in 1980 although nobody had it at home in 1920. Meanwhile, washing machines and vacuum cleaners' ownership portion which were 40% and 30%, respectively by 1920, had been as much as each other equal to 70% in 1960, subsequently vacuum cleaners' ownership with a stable rising trend had reached the maximum level in 2000. Therefore, all families have bought vacuum cleaner since 2000, whereas they have gotten accustomed to buying the refrigerator since 1980.

It is worth mentioning based on the latter graph, the hours spent weekly on performing house chores had been 50 hours declined considerably and reached 10 hours a week, approximately one-fifth of its initiative amount.
